Village of Youngstown Police Monthly Report January 2025

- -Myself and Chief Bosi were asked to participate in an Active Shooter drill at Lewiston Porter school. We acted as safety instructors and advised the younger officers. Lewiston Police department conducted the training along with NYSP, Border Patrol, NCSD, Town of Niagara PD, Transit PD and EMS. Approximately 100 law enforcement personal attended. This was the first time the Youngstown PD was asked to participate.
- -Myself and Chief Bosi were asked to participate in the annual Lewiston Light Parade. Approximately 1000 people watched the parade. This event was hosted by the Lewison Chamber of Commerce and the first time the Youngstown PD was invited.
- -We still are getting complaints of speeding vehicles on Church, Main and Lockport streets. We have concentrated radar in those areas.
- -Officer Brittney Price accepted a position with the NCSD. We are actively looking for 2 part-time positions.
- -We wrote 4 tickets, issued 12 warnings and responded to 6 police interactions/calls.
- -The Youngstown Police Department handled a harrasment/bullying investigation involving juveniles which led to the involvement of several other agencies. (Please report these type of incidents)
